THE SIR GEORGE ELLIOT CHARITABLE TRUST

The Sir George Elliot Charitable Trust was established in 1956. It has, over the years, supported many different community initiatives and projects. These have included the development of local hospices, the provision of facilities for the care of the elderly, the development of community facilities such as information centres, halls, large theatre complexes, and so on. Various schools have received support for projects related to the extension of facilities that can also be used by the community.

However, the current primary focus of the Sir George Elliot Charitable Trust is supporting young New Zealanders in their tertiary study through the Elliot Scholarships. The Elliot Scholarships reflect a restatement of the Trust's commitment to education in a way which balance that with community objectives. The intention is to support a group of young scholars who, given this first significant help towards tertiary qualifications, will go on to contribute to the well-being of the community in a wide range of spheres.

The trustees have decided to make each scholarship worth \$25,000, this being an amount that represents substantial help throughout the period of the first degree. At the moment, three scholarships are awarded each year. Scholars will be supported with advice and guidance and the trustees intend to be flexible in applying the guidelines they have established. The intention is clear, however – this is an investment in success and, through that success, in the development of the kind of community that Sir George Elliot worked towards in the first half of the twentieth century and towards which the trust is working in these early years of the twenty-first century.

Recently, to mark the twentieth anniversary of the Elliot Scholarships, the trustees inaugurated a special award known as the Sir George Elliot Fellowship. The Fellowship is awarded from time to time, at the discretion of the trustees, to a scholar whose work since receiving an Elliot Scholarships is regarded as having made a significant contribution to that scholar's field of endeavour, or who has exhibited outstanding community leadership or contribution. The Fellowship is marked with a substantial monetary award, a presentation diploma, and a commemorative New Zealand art work. The first Fellowship was conferred in 2022 on 2008 Elliot Scholar Dr Oscar Lyons, in recognition of his outstanding contribution to the field of medical leadership.

The Elliot Scholarships

There are three \$25,000 scholarships awarded each year. Each scholarship will be paid in equal annual instalments over the period of study towards a first degree. The scholarship funds may be used towards tuition costs.

AWARD TO SCHOOL

In addition to the scholarship award and in recognition of the school's contribution, the Trust makes a donation of \$750 to the learning resources of each successful applicant's school.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Having identified a candidate who is likely to meet the scholarship criteria, any secondary school in the Auckland region may apply.

One application per school per year may be made. The applicant must have the endorsement of their principal.

The scholarship criteria include proven academic success and the requirement that the candidate face family, personal and/or economic circumstances that have required exceptional effort and have posed exceptional challenges for the candidate.

WHO WILL BE SUCCESSFUL?

The Trust has established criteria that are enclosed with the application material. In summary, the successful applicants will ...

- be likely to succeed in their proposed course of study
- have demonstrated academic achievement and real potential to succeed in tertiary study
- have demonstrated personal qualities of leadership
- have shown potential for contributing to the community
- have made exceptional effort or faced exceptional challenges as a result of their family, personal or economic circumstances.

Sir George Elliot

Sir George Elliot was a benefactor, philanthropist, and successful businessman who died in 1956 after a long life of involvement in the work of the community.

Born in Scotland in 1865, he migrated to New Zealand and after running a newspaper in Tauranga, became involved in flax-milling before moving to Auckland to enter business with his brother.

He was president of the Auckland Chamber of Commerce in 1911-12. The idea of the Auckland Exhibition was mooted in 1912 and after a dispute over whether it should be held at Victoria Park or in the Domain, Sir George took up the position of president of the exhibition. Its subsequent success is in large measure a tribute to his skill and business acumen. The Wintergardens in the Auckland Domain are a permanent tribute to the exhibition and his leadership.

During World War I Sir George was a member of the National Efficiency Board, a member of the Military Service Board and president of the Patriotic Society. After the war he chaired various commissions into, among other things, the influenza epidemic in Samoa, and trade relations between New Zealand and various Pacific islands. He was knighted in 1923.

His business career was marked by involvement with the Bank of New Zealand (as director), the South British Insurance Company, Wilsons (NZ) Portland Cement Ltd, Milne and Choyce Ltd, the New Zealand Insurance Company, and Phillipps and Impey Ltd. His involvement with the BNZ spanned nearly twenty years and included a long period as chairman.

The Sir George Elliot Charitable Trust was established in 1956 to support community work and education. Sir George had long been interested in education, and this had been demonstrated earlier by his very significant donation for the establishment of St Kentigern's College and his generous support for St Cuthbert's College. It was characteristic of the man that these donations were made anonymously and only became public later.

Geoff Clews is a senior barrister specialising in contentious tax and trusts matters. He has been a trustee of the Elliott Trust since 1987. Outside his legal practice Geoff has held several prominent public, philanthropic and arts governance roles, and quasi-judicial appointments. Over some 30 years he led campaigns which established three performing arts facilities in Auckland, at local and regional levels. Since 2006, he has been involved in a variety of education consultancy positions. He has also served as a trustee on the New Zealand Youth Mentoring Network and he has been a member of The University of Auckland's Starpath Board and the university's interviewing panels for the selection of applicants for secondary teacher training. Bill has been a trustee of the Elliot Trust since 2008.

Hamish McCarroll LLB, BA

Hamish McCarroll was an Elliot Scholar in 2000 after attending Sacred Heart College, Auckland as a boarder from Tauranga. In 2001 he attended Victoria University of Wellington where he studied Law, International Relations and English Literature. After studying on exchange in The Netherlands he returned in 2006 and spent eight years working in finance as an equity derivatives trader for Dutch and Belgian banks. Hamish returned to New Zealand in 2014, and has been working in export markets since, firstly with Kraft Heinz / Wattie's, and currently as Export Manager at Ecostore. Hamish has been actively involved with the Trust on selection panels since 2016, and a trustee as of 2017.

Bronwyn Heath BSc

Bronwyn was a 2003 recipient of the Elliot Scholarship out of Manurewa High School. After completing a Bachelor of Science (Statistics and Psychology), she spent the next eight years in London working as a Quantitative Strategist for Medtech companies. Bronwyn returned to New Zealand in 2013 joining Business Toolbox, now as Managing Director, which specialises in software for people management. Bronwyn was a finalist in the 2023 Entrepreneur of the Year awards for WICTA and is also an active mentor for women in technology. She has served as trustee for the Elliott Trust since 2020.

Lewis Grant LLB

Lewis Grant has been involved with the Sir George Elliot Charitable Trust for many years as the Trust's legal advisor. He recently retired from legal practice and was welcomed on board as a trustee of the Trust in 2023. Lewis was a partner in the Auckland law firm Martelli McKegg, and, for over 40 years, specialised in private client, trust and estate law. Prior to his retirement, he was a trustee of several hundred trusts, including those of well-known old New Zealand families. Before joining Martelli McKegg in November 2012, Lewis was a partner of an Auckland based boutique trusts and estates law firm, which he co-founded in 2002. Lewis is a member of several charitable trust boards, including several large public charitable trusts, one of which he is the current chairman.

Joy Eaton BA, Dip SM, Dip Tchg

Joy joined the Elliot Trust Board in October 2019. She is an experienced Geography and Social Studies teacher starting her career in Tangaroa College before moving to West Auckland. She was appointed to several senior manager roles including being the Principal of Henderson High School. In 2011 she was appointed Deputy Director of Auckland University's Starpath Project, a research project looking into the impacts of socio-economic status on educational achievement. Since then she has been the General Manager of the New Zealand Youth Mentoring Network supporting mentoring organisations across Aotearoa. She has a strong interest in the role of hope in sustaining innovation and change, she believes in the power of intergenerational connections to develop stable positive community for the benefit of us all.

Steve Corbett BCom CA

Steve has been engaged in the entrepreneurial and innovation side of education for the past 20 years.
